

We've had a fantastic, event-filled summer across Five Rivers and we're looking forward to an exciting fall and winter.

Bonar Law Common, which hosted our new Roots & Rivers festival, received several upgrades this summer, including a new cedar fence along the river, new parking posts, a new water pump, a refurbished hen house, and a new railing for the deck at the museum. All of these great upgrades were planned and completed by our own Public Works team. We also recently met with officials from the provincial government to coordinate upgrades to the Bonar Law House and Farm, with plans to reopen both to the public next year.

In June, Five Rivers launched its new website. Our new site offers lots of new information and features, including historical timelines and photos, an improved community calendar, direct access to Council meeting videos, and user-friendly, self-serve forms and applications.

This fall, as our kids head back to school and we breathe the crisp air of pumpkin season, Five Rivers is due to complete several more projects to benefit the community.
